### General Synopsis for Episode #1101

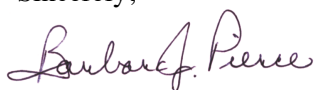
In this episode, committed and talented ‘young icons’ share their stories of success. The guests open up the personal side of their journey and what made them decide to pursue their goals and take care of their community. **Kelli Berglund** is a sixteen-year-old who loves to tell a story through her dancing. She became interested in acting from a friend and is currently on Disney’s *XD Lab Rats*. Kelli gives back to her community by getting kids active at the local Boys and Girls Club. She wants to set a good example to others and states, “If you give 110% you are bound to go somewhere, it takes hard work”.

**Teagan Stedman** is an eleven-year-old who founded the Shred Kids Cancer nonprofit charity that helps fund cancer research. Through fundraising events like Shr3dfest, which is a battle of the bands contest, the charity has raised over \$40,000. He feels other young teens look up to him because he doesn’t quit; he thinks big and believes in what he is doing. Seventeen-year-old **Gabby Enriquez** creates blankets for children in homeless shelters through the Knots For Love project. She credits her family for teaching the power of giving back. She sells her famous homemade salsa to fund this community project and recruits volunteers to help make the blankets. Fourteen-year-old entrepreneur **Henry Miller** had so much sweet honey from his beehives that he created spicy honey. With his parents help, he started the company Henry’s Humdingers to sell his honey products, which are now in 100 stores on the east coast. Henry shares that his goal is to do as much as possible and is grateful to bees.

### Observation and Conclusion

In episode #1101, teens will relate and be inspired by these inventive high achievers as role models giving them hope to achieve success. This episode of *The Young Icons* delivers an educational and informational message that supports current social, intellectual and emotional aspects of children ages 13 and up.
