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## **A Day at The Cologne Zoo**


### General Synopsis for Episode #1309

In this episode of Pets.tv **A Day at The Cologne Zoo** tour guide Jenny Buckley takes the viewers to the oldest and largest zoo in Germany. The tour starts with a cruise on the Rhine River seeing the popular sites of the city of Cologne, Germany. The viewers meet Christoph Schutt from the Cologne Zoo's press department telling the audience that the zoo was built in 1860, is as large as 20 football fields and has over one million visitors a year. With over 10,000 animals and 850 species the show highlights unique residents with informative facts about each animal. Meerkats are mammals from Africa. They are small carnivores from the mongoose family and families are known as a Mob, Ganger or Clan. The Cologne Zoo is known to have one the largest elephant parks in Europe housing 16 Asian elephants. The baboon exhibit dates back to 1914. There is a moat surrounding the enclosure of the troop of 30 Hamadryas baboons. The main attraction at the Cologne Zoo is the HippoDom. Baby Nils and her mother Jenny entertain the viewers by swimming and knowing when it is time for their feeding. There is a 20<sup>th</sup> century Primate enclosure to get a face to face view of gorillas. The tour ends with visiting the Aquarium arranged by geographic locations and the Terrarium of exotic amphibians.

### Observation and Conclusion

Episode #1309 is an engaging and entertaining show that will hold the interest of young viewers being exposed to specific knowledge and background information about the unique animals at the Cologne Zoo in Germany.
