
### General Synopsis for Episode #1113

In this episode, committed and talented ‘young philanthropists’ share their stories of success. The guests open up the personal side of their journey and what made them decide to pursue their goals. Playing a cancer victim in a movie, 8-year-old **Emily Lind** wants to make wishes come true for kids who are sick. She has decorated a love fund box to collect donations from casting crews to give to the Make A Wish Foundation. She credits learning to be grateful from her mom. Emily shares, “When you do something good for others, good things will happen to you too.” Seven-year-old **Jonas Corona** founded Love in the Mirror, a charitable organization to help the homeless and needy by collecting donated food, toys, clothing and backpacks. He wants kids to feel good about themselves no matter what their life situation entails. For 10 years, **Rachel Rosenblum** has donated over 10,000 teddy bears and stuff animals to ill children in hospitals. Her non-profit organization called Rachel’s Hug a Bear inspires others to get involved by encouraging teddy bear drives in their community. The Oprah Show exposed **Tyler Page** to the issue of child trafficking in Ghana, West Africa. He wanted to do something about getting kids out of slavery so he held a car wash raising \$1100, which would free 4.7 kids. He has created an organization called Kids Helping Kids to raise money for other charities in other parts of the world. He states, “It makes me feel great because I’m impacting other people’s lives”.

### Observation and Conclusion

In episode #1113, teens will relate to high achievers as role models that hopefully will inspire them to give back to others in need. This episode of The Young Icons delivers an educational and informational message that supports current social, intellectual and emotional aspects of children ages 13 and up. Attributes and advice emphasized by guests instill a grounded balance of priorities, commitment, and perseverance children can apply to their lives.
